

THESIS FORMATTING GUIDELINES AND REQUIREMENTS

The Academic Coordinator in the Graduate Division can answer any questions you may have (502-4460).

BINDING:

It is the student's responsibility to have your thesis bound. The cost of binding is also the student's responsibility. You may have your thesis bound in any style you wish.

UNBOUND Copies: You will be required to submit an unbound copy of your thesis to the Graduate Division.

BOUND Copies: You will need to provide bound copies to your PI, your thesis committee members (and to the program office if you wish).

Many students have used Herring & Robinson Bookbinders for their thesis binding. You are welcome to choose another binder, but the advantage to using H&R is that they will pick up and deliver at no extra charge.

Herring & Robinson Bookbinders sends a representative to UCSF on Thursdays for pickup and/or delivery of theses for binding. They go to both Parnassus (at around 2pm) and to Mission Bay (late morning). When you call to make the appointment tell the representative what room you want him to go to and he'll give you a window of about an hour for his arrival. You will have to give him all your printed pages (they don't do any copying, just binding), and he'll bring color samples for the cover. It takes about 2 weeks total. The cost per copy is \$21.50, which includes lettering on the spine. The representative will give you an invoice at the time of delivery and you can mail them a check.
